He was a lifetime member of the Third and Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus and active in numerous charitable fund raising efforts for community projects. In the 1980's he was instrumental in starting the Comox Valley Charitable Bingo Association an umbrella organization that supported various Valley charities. He served both as a board member and an executive member of the Bingo Council of BC.

During the summer Bill loved to be outdoors, but especially enjoyed just being out on his boat. Winter would find him enjoying curling with the Seniors Curling League. At any time of the year you could find him tinkering in his workshop. Bill's family will be forever grateful to everyone who made his last six weeks at home possible.
